

COMPLETED PROJECT

Commonwealth Bank Building – Darling Square

Elegantly integrating skylights, sunshades and curved and overhead glazing with the spectacular frameless entry.





Curved panels and shaped horizontal sun shading were integral to achieving the architect's vision for CBA's brand new premises at Darling Park in Sydney.

The façade was constructed with carefully selected individual components integrated into the modular panels, a key feature being the operable elliptical louvres over the main building atrium glazing.





Curved glazing

We integrated curved glazing, both convex and concave, abutting into the large span atrium to showcase the building's main feature.

Fire safety

Operable aluminium and frameless glass louvres are connected to the building's BMS system and programmed to open if there's a fire.

Zinc panels

Both curved and straight zinc curtain wall façade panels were purposely refined to create a seamless façade appearance.
